


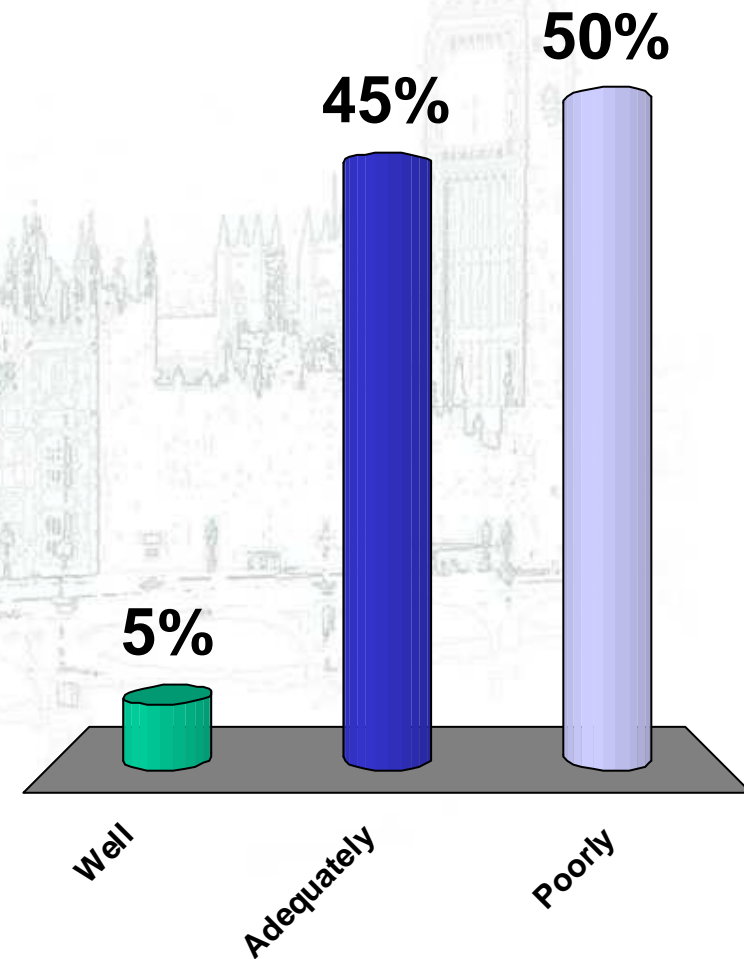

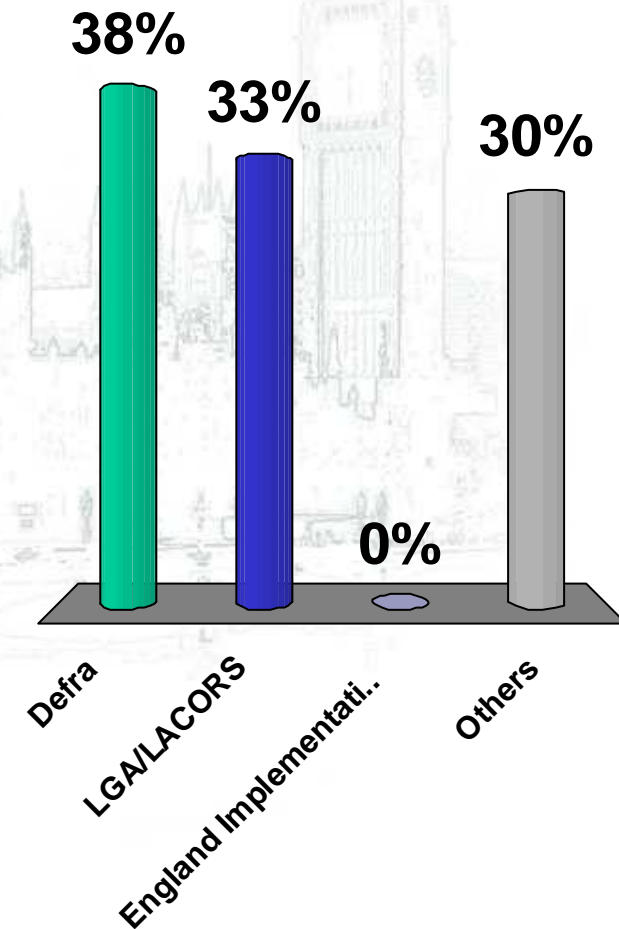
How well do you think

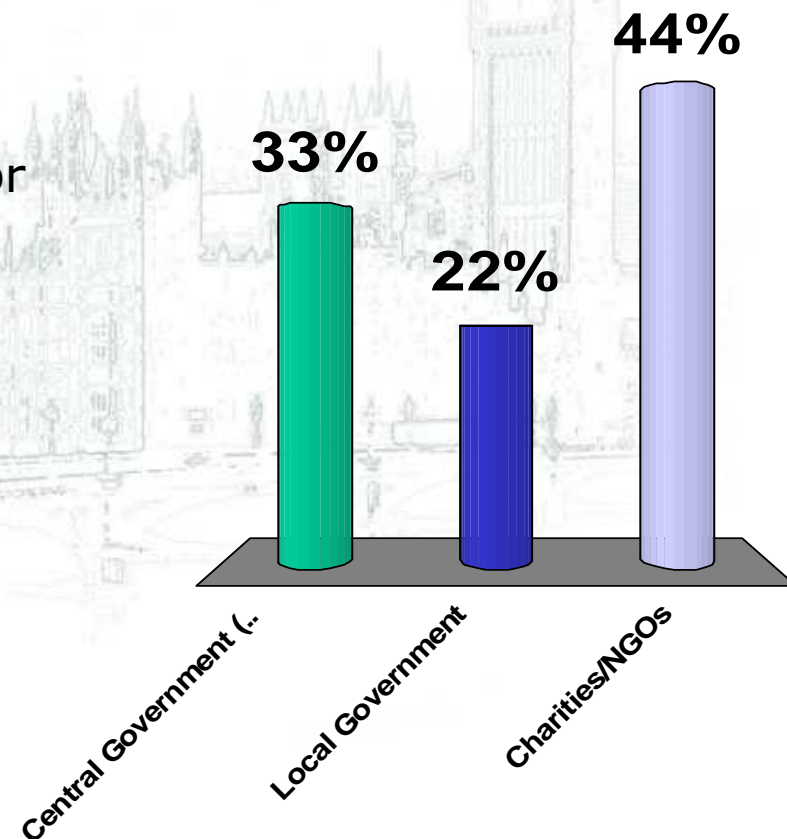
Who should take the bulk of responsibility for welfare enforcement?

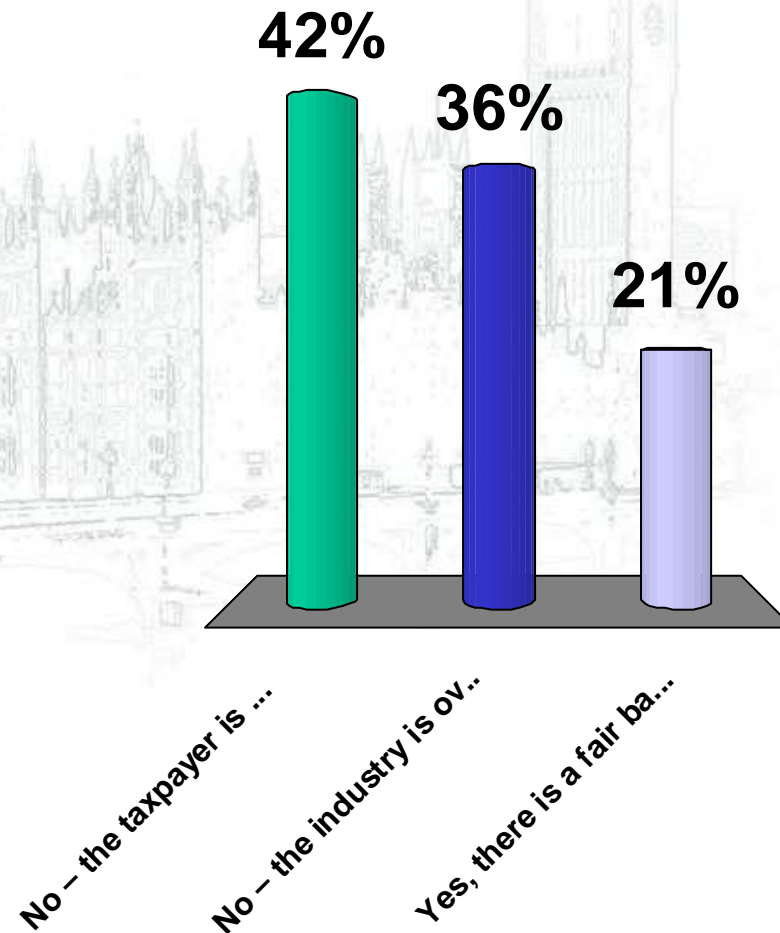
Who should take primary responsibility for educating the public on animal health and welfare?

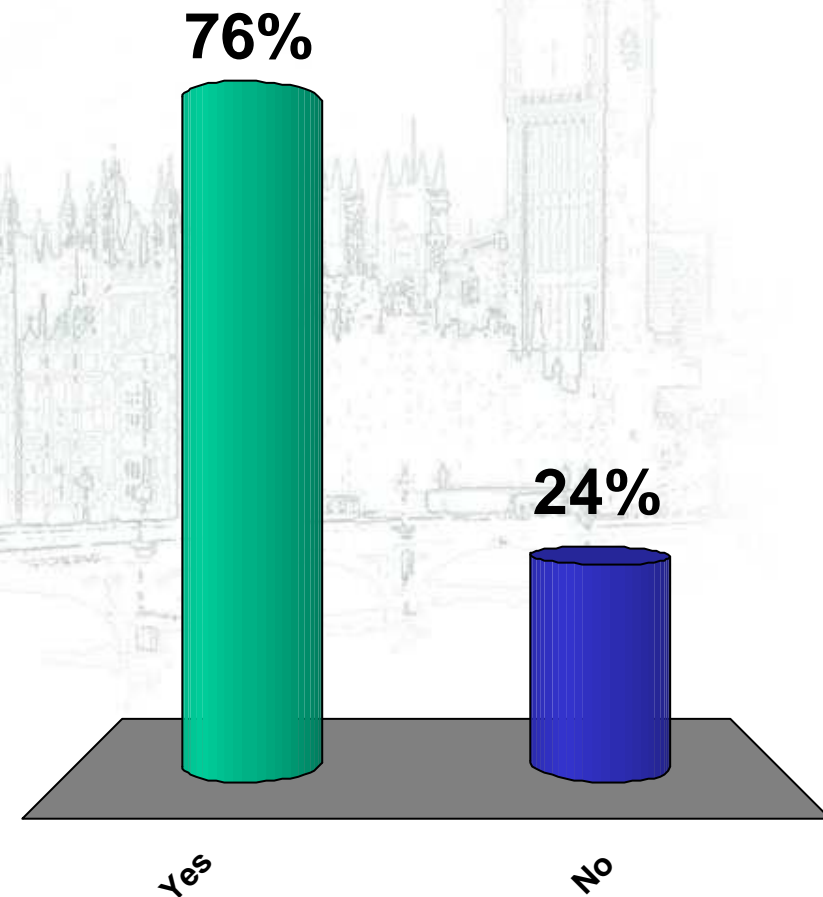
Do you feel that the current distribution of animal welfare costs accurately reflects where the balance of responsibility and benefits lie?

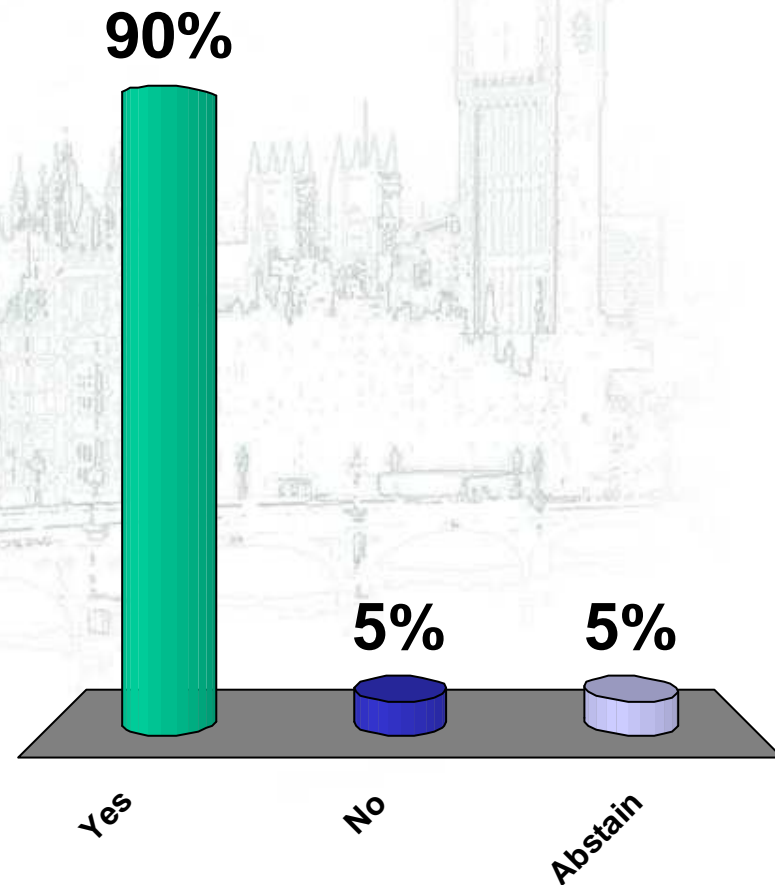
Do you think that there is an increased acceptance among consumers that higher standards of animal health and welfare do not come for free?

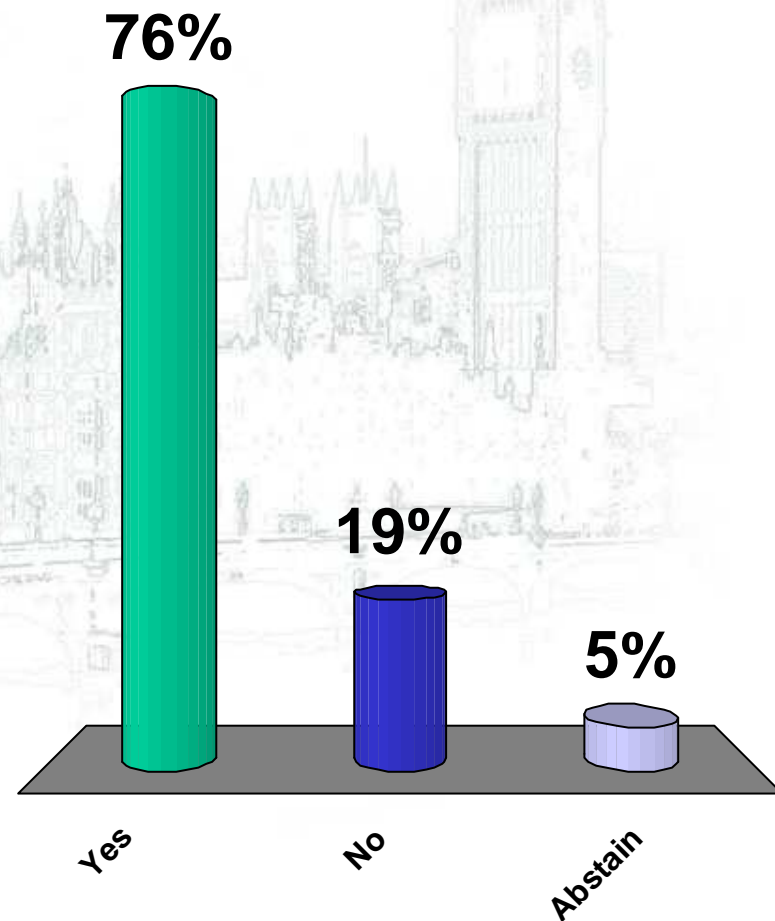

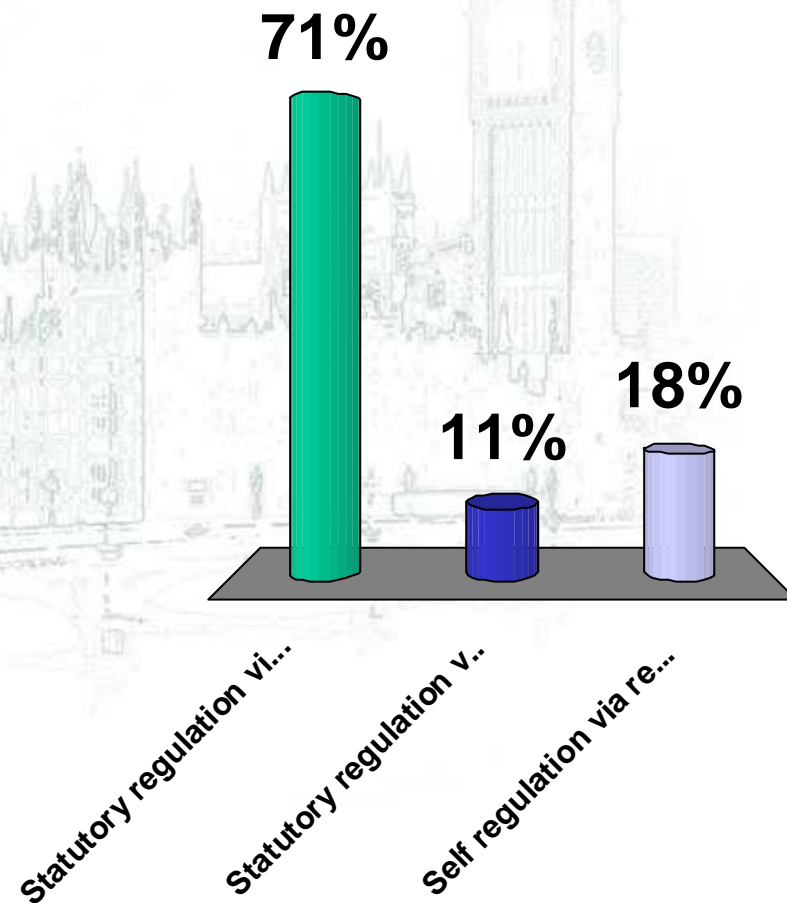
Would you see benefit in a universal standard on animal rights, with governments agreeing a common set of principles to respect and protect animal welfare?

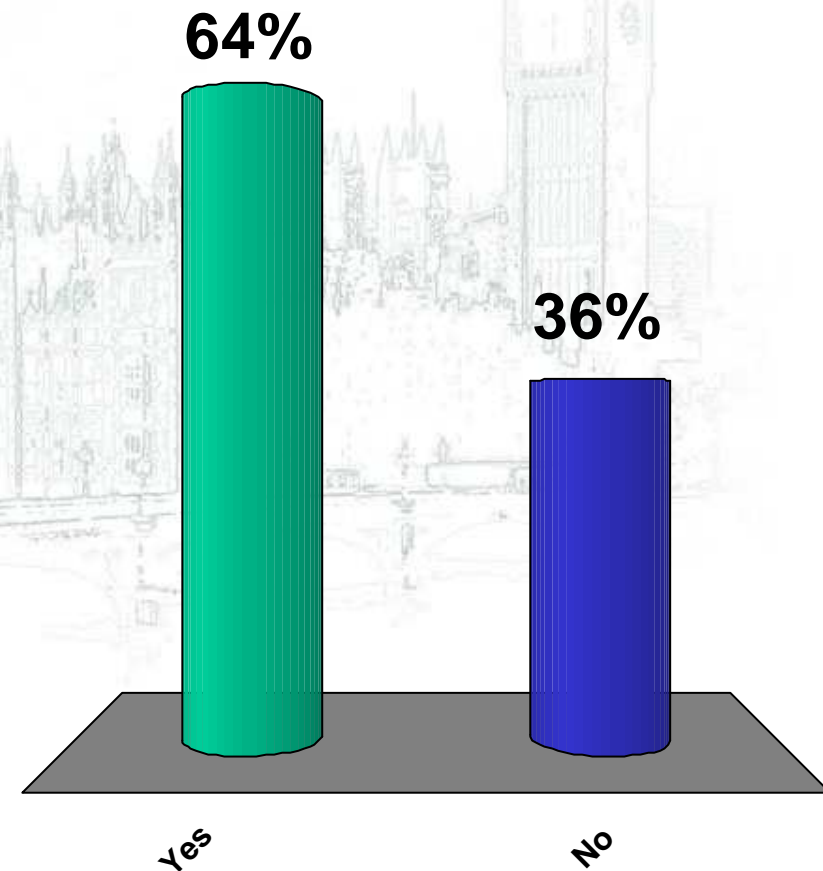
What is the most effective means of regulation in terms of improving animal health and welfare?
