


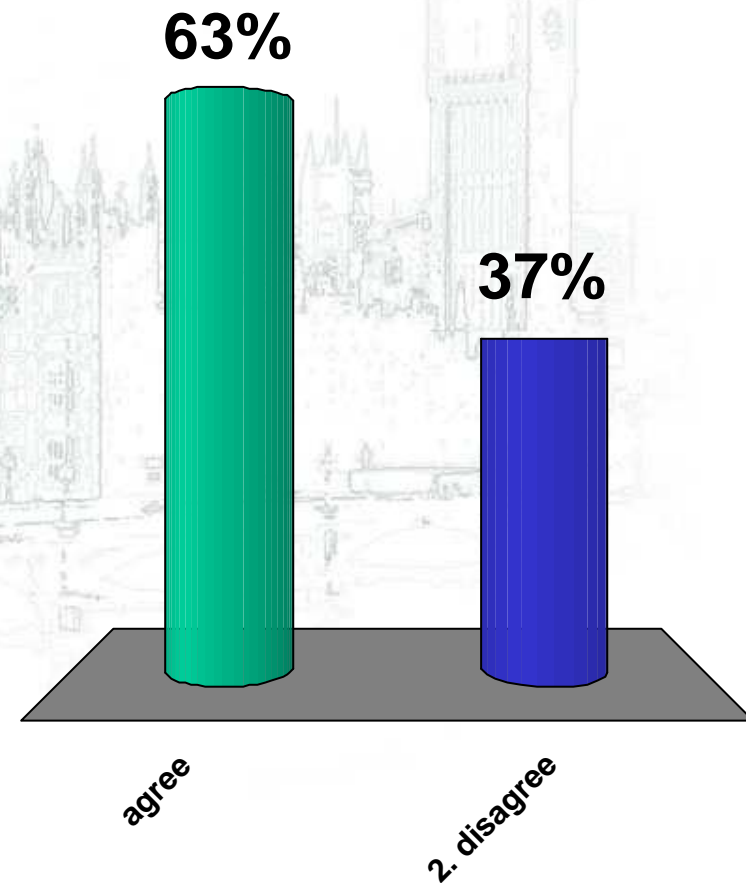

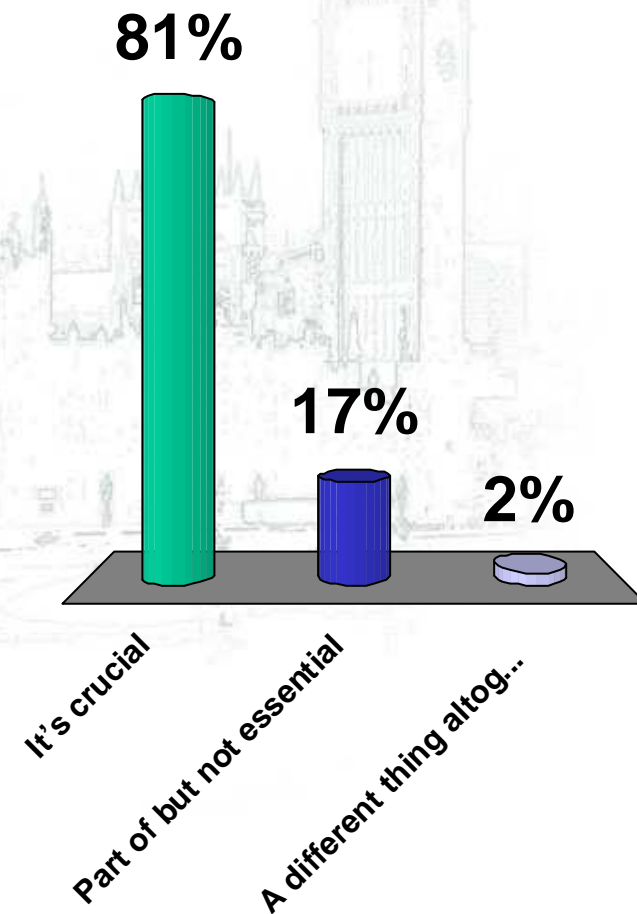
Do you agree that cohesion has not been clearly defined?

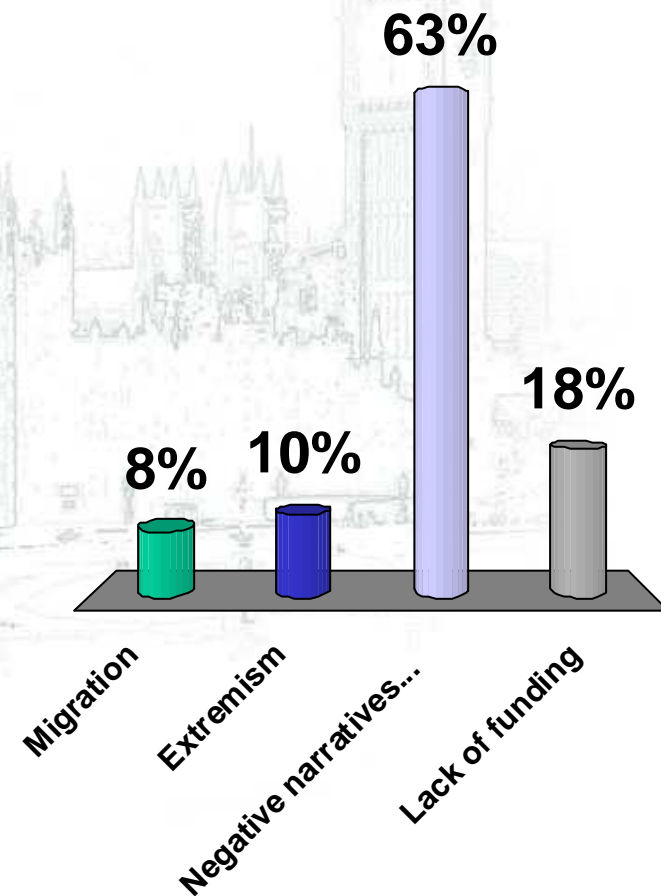
How important do you think the equalities debate is to community cohesion?

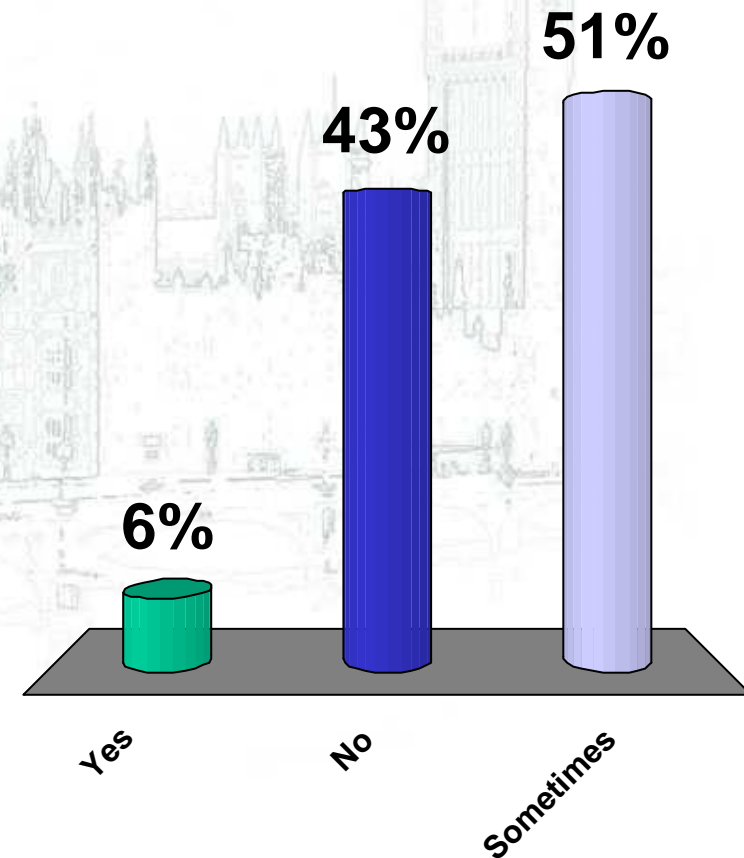
What do you think are the biggest challenges to promoting community cohesion?

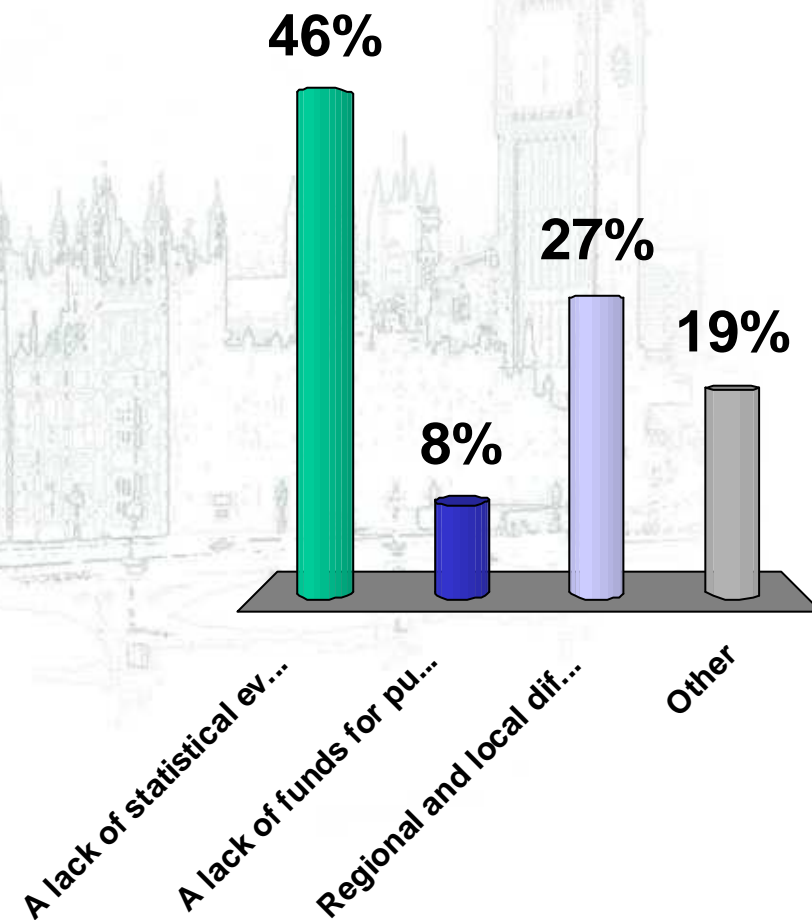
Do you think that community cohesion issues are currently given sufficient consideration in local authorities wider policy making and practice?

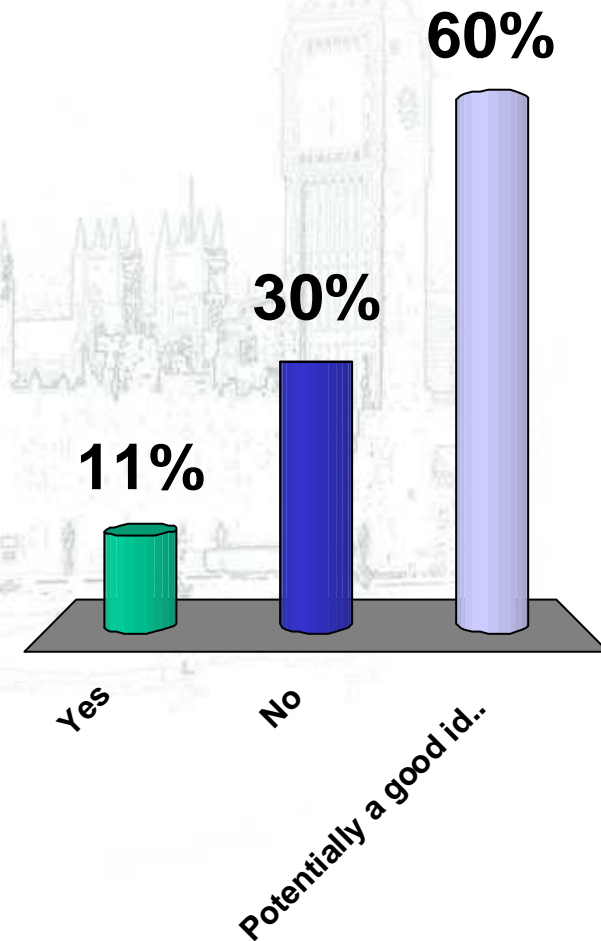
What would you say is the primary difficulty in formulating a nationwide strategy for managing population growth?

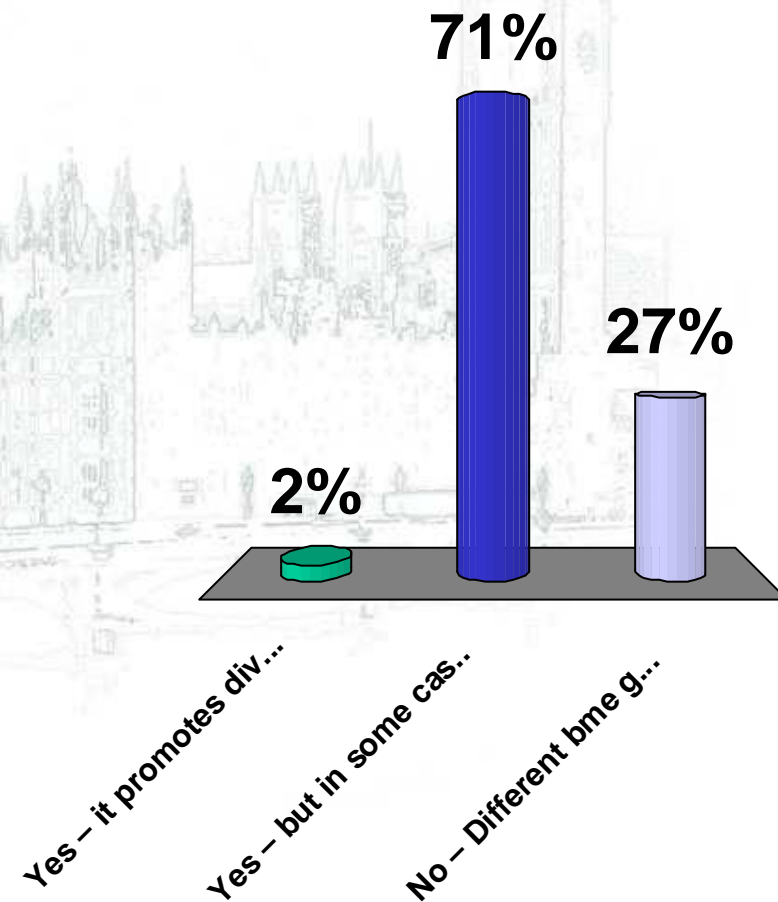
Would you support the idea of specialist cohesion teams working with local authorities?
