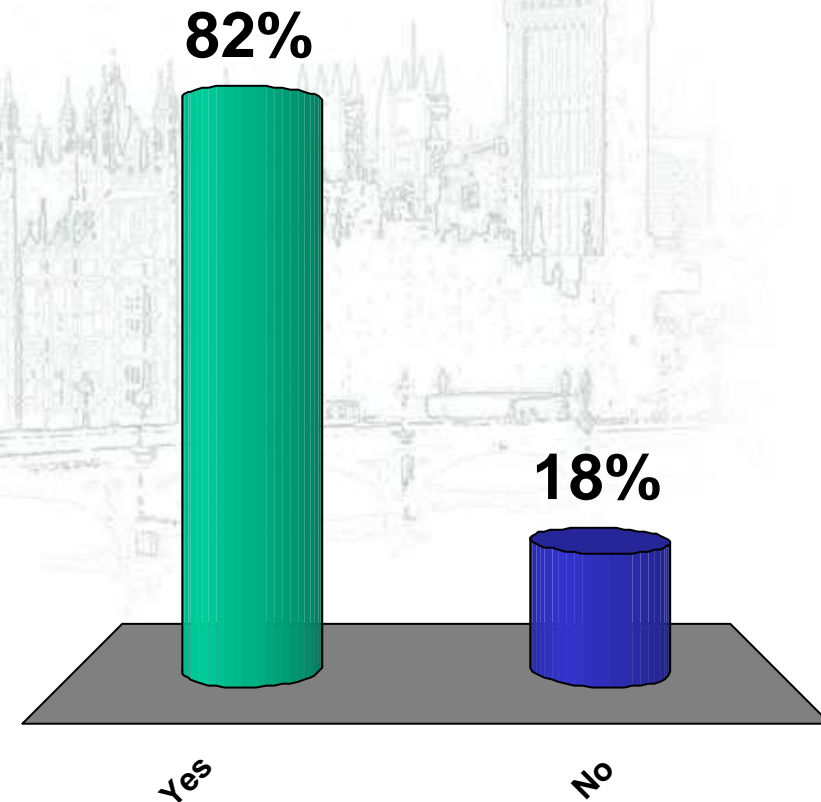

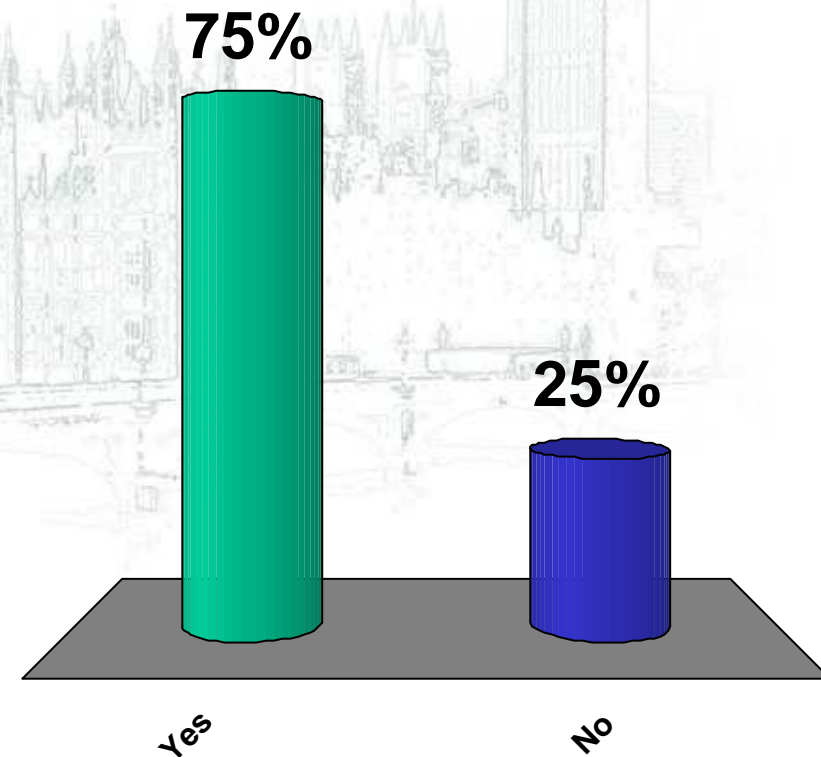
Should there be further regulation in relation to school admissions?

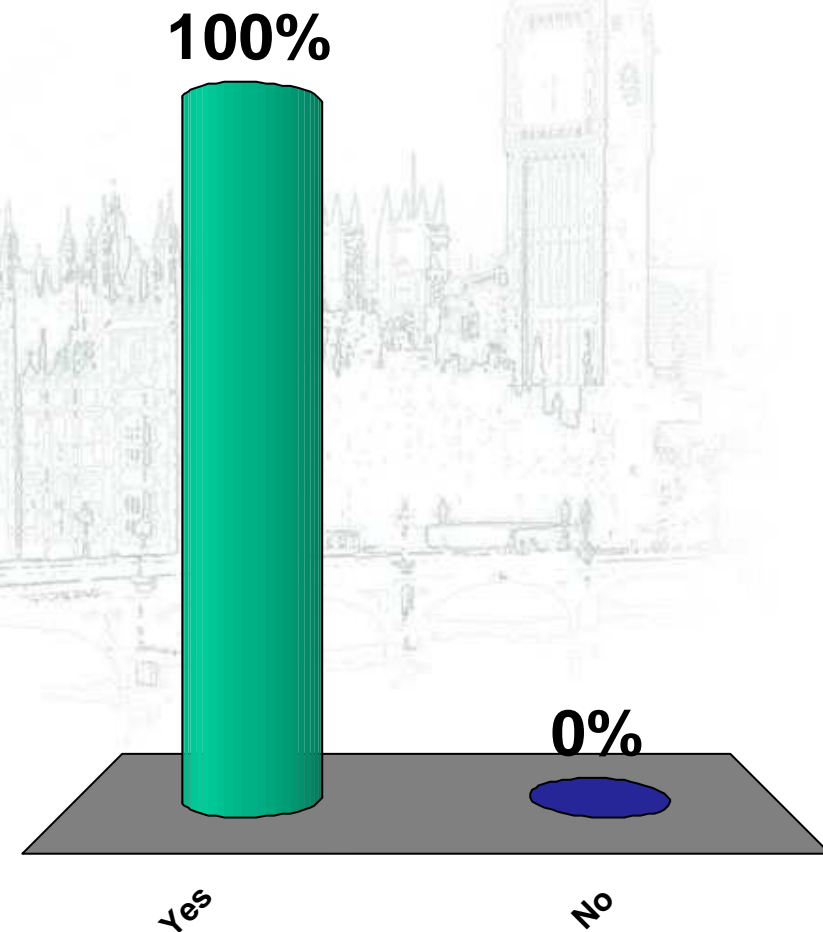
Should there be fewer admissions authorities?

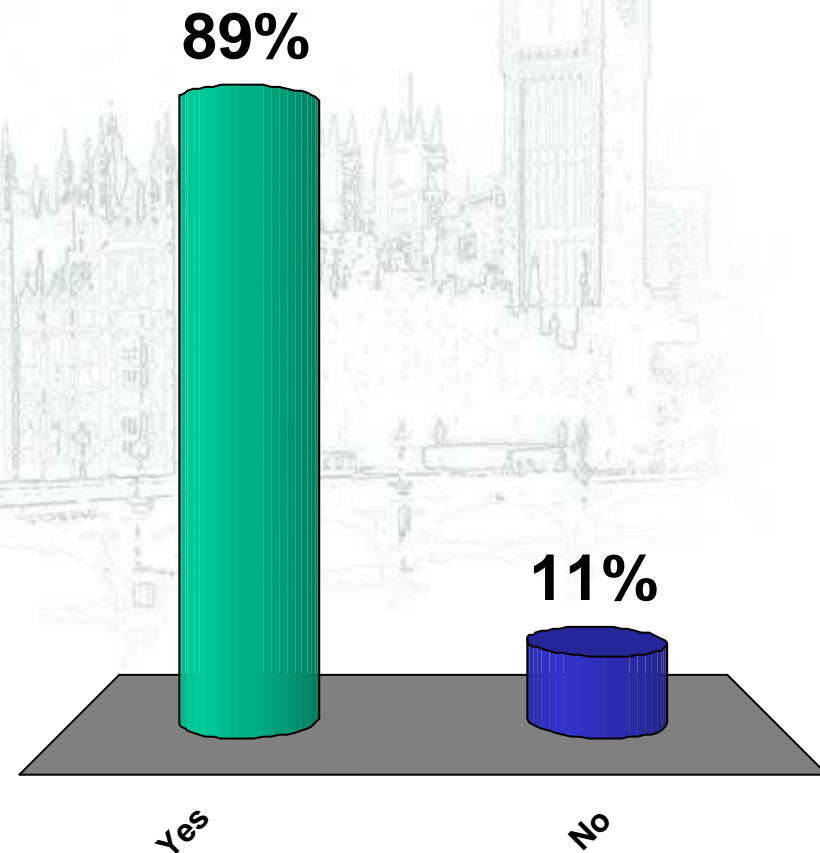

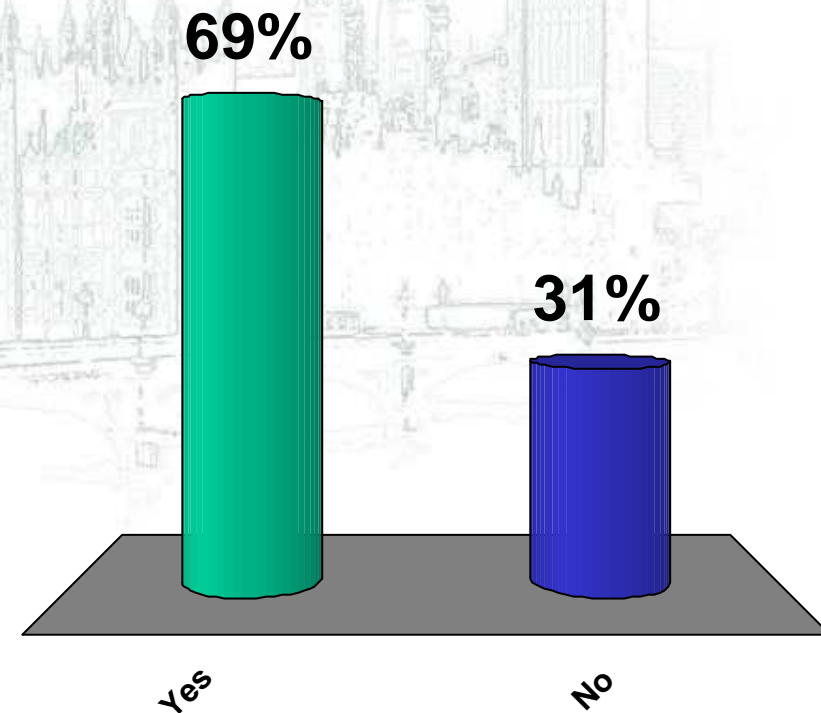

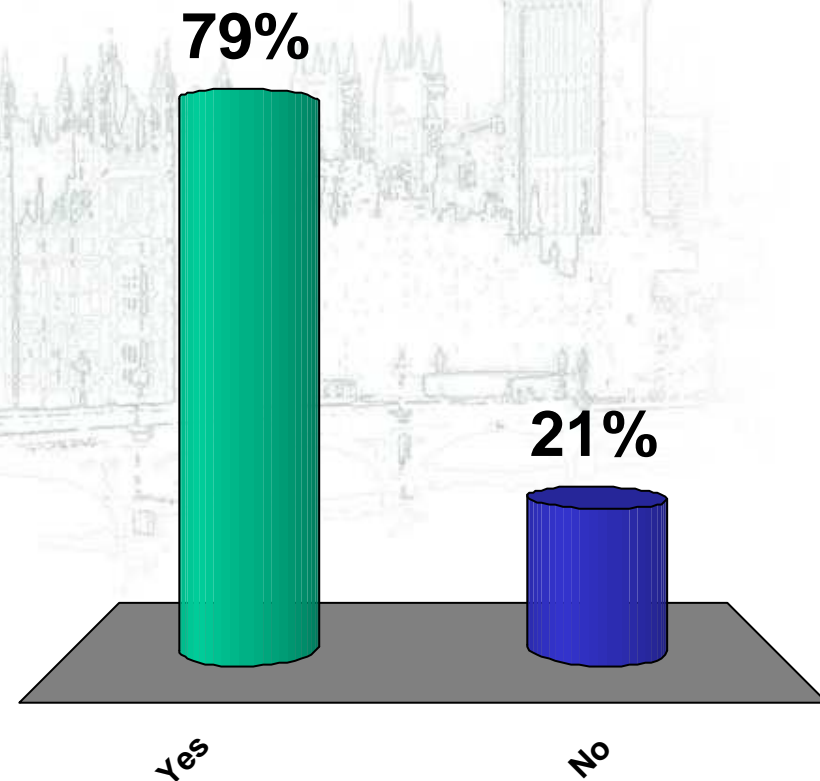

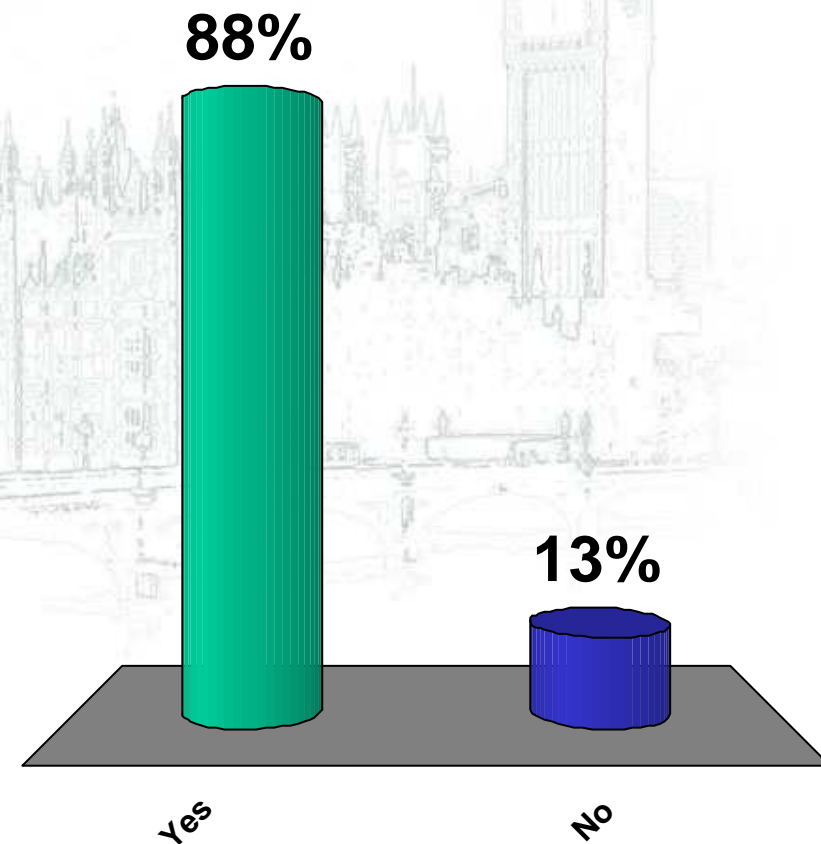
